Course entry requirements

Course content

This Workshop is designed to support nurses, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioners and workers and other health professionals to better support patients with or at risk of developing diabetes.

The course covers critical knowledge areas such as pathophysiology, medications and injection techniques, blood glucose monitoring, screening and referral pathways.

Learning outcomes

The workshop is designed to provide a broad range of skills and knowledge that can deliver immediate results for patients. The learning outcomes include:

- Refresh knowledge on the pathophysiology of diabetes and different types of diabetes mellitus.
- Describe common diabetes medications, their actions, side effects and contraindications.
- Discuss insulin therapy, including different modes of actions and the education to offer clients around insulin administration.
- Demonstrate an understanding of hypoglycaemia, hyperglycaemia and diabetic ketoacidosis.
- Review principles of Blood Glucose Monitoring and the education to offer to clients regarding this.
- Explore psychological impact of living with diabetes.
- Understand your local diabetes care pathways.
